THE ONGOING SAGA OF ROUTE 74 1974 -2015

Following correspondence in the last edition of the Eldwick Newsletter it is pertinent to revisit this subject once more, despite at least two earlier stories referring to its history published here some years ago.

Eldwick has some scenic byways, none more interesting than a former pack horse trail. In post medieval times the 'Broggers' carried a variety of goods from markets into countryside villages. Locally they would buy small parcels of yarn and woven cloth from out farms and cottages to carry them to markets in Otley, Bradford and Leeds. This encouraged local communities to continue the spinning and weaving occupations in their homes.

In the 1841 and 1851 Census returns for Eldwick Beck listed the majority of householders as either wool combers or worsted weavers, including nearly everyone living in New Row (later Long Row).

Coming into the Eldwick Beck hamlet, from the valley or along Rivock Edge, via Morton, it is off Heights Lane to Tewitt, the former trail is instantly recognisable with its single line of paving stones. It arrives at Eldwick Beck, close to the 17th century corn/scribbling mill and the site of the former New Row cottages eventually occupied by mill workers. The Eldwick Mill had been opened as a Corn Mill by Richard Longbottom of Eldwick Hall but after the industrial revolution it became a scribbling mill - machines powered by a water wheel fed by the long snaking dam which had a sluice from Eldwick Beck, began to process raw wool.

When the row was demolished, a single building was built which diminished the width of the bridleway, leading to the historic Clapper Bridge over the Beck. From there the route climbed up Mill Lane to Lane Head in Otley Road, across along Birch Close Lane, through Faweather to Intake Gate and eventually towards Otley.

For years there were various

obstructions on Bridleway 74 from the junction with Tewitt Lane to Lane Head which had to be cleared. In May 2003 that section was closed, mainly because the bridge was deemed unsafe and a diversion was being considered. The owner of the 'new' building, then called 'Brooklands', (now 'Beck Cottage') had objected to the old route through the garden of the property, passing in front of the bungalow.

Over the years, negotiations and objections continued as six monthly renewals were imposed on the closure notice. In February 2005 a Diversion Order was published to take the Bridleway 74 away from the garden and building, off The Green, around the boundary of the property. A variety of objectors stated they would accept the diversion as a bridleway but insisted pedestrian rights were retained on the original route due to its historic heritage. This was because the bridleway was dual purpose — for equestrians and pedestrians.

In December 2006 an Inspector, appointed by the Office of The Secretary of State came to call. All evidence was considered and the ensuing five page report concluded that the Diversion Order could not be confirmed because, as the objectors had made clear, the diversion would take the footpath with it. The Inspector added that it was not her responsibility to make an amendment but accepted that changes would be beneficial for equestrians, to avoid the old bridge. Further she stipulated that it was the responsibility of the Council to issue further Orders to address the situation to retain the route through the garden.

So the whole route was reopened in 2007 and celebrated with an announcement in the Eldwick Newsletter and the magazine of the Ramblers Association.

It took until September 2010 for Bradford Council to issue the



necessary orders, by which time the plan for the diverted route had been agreed by themselves, the owner of Brooklands and the owners of the farmland onto which the bridleway would overlap.

The first of the new Orders was the Public Diversion Order which confirmed that the alternative bridleway could be created, subject to objections. There were none, because the second Order was published simultaneously. This was worded, Public Bridleway No 74 (Bingley) (Part) Eldwick Beck Bingley (Public Footpath) (Creation) Order) 2010.

All went ahead, with the newly diverted bridleway having its route constructed, linking the old pack horse route – down from Tewitt into the Green with Mill Lane to Lane Head.

Most importantly, from that time, the Footpath 74, through the garden in front of Beck Cottage and over the old Clapper Bridge, had been recreated, retained and remains, to this day a Public Right of Way for everyone to enjoy. At the moment there appears to no longer be a yellow waymark indicating this route but doubtless this can be remedied by the local Rights of Way Officers who have always worked hard to maintain the rest of the route.
