MYSTERIOUS HALLUCINATION

There are many houses in Eldwick, some still standing, some long gone, that have or have had interesting stories to tell. The skeleton in chains in Eldwick Hall's cellars, and Park House and Hammondale (now Netherdale), both supposedly built as pubs. Best of all, the notorious double murder in a cottage in 'Strawberry Fields' in Saltaire Road which resulted in a memorial window in St. Lawrence's Church for one of the victims.

One, in a much lighter vein is about Spring Field in Otlev Road, not to be confused with Springfield House on the other side of the road. Today Springfield is two dwellings, accessed by a dirt track next to Meadowcroft, but in the past it was one house, almost a farmhouse with land in front and behind.

The story was told one hundred and ten years ago about a 'Poor Man's Phantom Wealth' relating to a 'Strange Property Purchase at Eldwick'. The principal characters in this 'visionary drama of wealth' were Mr Charles Wilkinson, farmer of Spring Field, Eldwick and a Mr Charles Firth of Bradford who was associated with the Temperance Hall. The farm had three fields and was tenanted by Mr Wilkinson as well as some cottages. It was said that several villas in Eldwick had sprung up rapidly and Bingley Council had considered and passed plans for property to be erected on an estate on 'Garden City' lines. This was to be on today's Grange Road but only The Manor House and six cottages were built before the plans were abandoned, 'the site being far too exposed'. Mr Wilkinson decided that once he found a suitable purchaser he would dispose of his estate and put it into the market by erecting a notice board facing on to

Otley Road 'This House and Land for Sale, Apply Within'.

The notice was up during the Easter holidays with a view to directing the attention of the many people who visited Eldwick at such time. The first person to call was the gentleman from Bradford, Mr Firth, He fell in love with the property and surroundings at first sight and 'immediately prosecuted enquiries' with a view to purchase. He was informed that the price was £1,625 which he thought was a reasonable amount and agreed to purchase at that figure. In the course of the conversation with Mr Wilkinson he announced his intention of building more cottages on the farm land. On the following day he returned to Eldwick and brought an architect with him. He paid the owner £20 'with which to fasten the purchase'.

He then carefully inspected the farm house and gave instructions with regard to the fixing of a telephone and other improvements. He also paid a visit to Mr Rhodes Royston of the well-known Eldwick family of quarry owners and stone masons and asked him for an estimate of stone to be used in the cottages. He erection also approached the Bingley Sanitary Tube and Lime Company in Heights Lane with a like request, presumably for bricks.

In a few days Mr Wilkinson received a letter from a firm of Bradford solicitors asking on behalf of Mr Firth to see the deeds. Facts however at that point came to light in Bradford, which pointed to Mr Firth 'being under delusions regarding his wealth'. It appeared that, on returning from his first visit to Eldwick, he made an arrangement with a Mr Sutcliffe, auctioneer, for the sale of his household furniture. Posters were accordingly issued to announce the

sale. He borrowed £12 from the auctioneer on account and, with an additional £8 from friends, he paid the deposit on the Eldwick property.

Subsequently returning to Bradford he hired a carriage and pair and drove round to a number of friends, inviting them to pay him a visit at his new farm. At the end of the drive, when asked for payment by the driver, he attacked him with a poker. The following day Firth went to another cab proprietor and told him he was going to his summer residence in Harrogate and would like a coach with his horses ridden by postilions to take him there. The proprietor realised this would be customer to be somewhat strange and politely refused. Firth told him 'I have done with you forever'.

In Bradford he asked another auctioneer to sell up the Wholesale Market on his behalf and told various shopkeepers to give away goods to the poor, and he would pay for them. Workmen on their way to work were stopped by him and assured that 'they would have no need to trudge to their toil any more' as he would make them all rich men.

The news of this eccentricity came to Firth's friends and it deemed advisable that he should undergo some medical examination, and the upshot was that 'he was ordered to a retreat'. It was realised that a strategy would have to be used to induce him to go there for, with the exception of 'matters touching on his phantom wealth' and the farm he had bought, he appeared to be perfectly reasonable and sane.

So what became of Mr Firth in this 'Sad Story of a Remarkable Delusion'? **ALLAN MIRFIELD**
