# ELDWICK & GILSTEAD HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY

We enjoyed an interesting and unexpected talk on 19 January. Whilst we knew it was to be about St. Ives estate we expected Pam Larkin to talk to us about the plants and gardens. Pam, however, was not well so her colleague Susan Hart, from the Friends of St. Ives, stepped in with a fascinating talk on the history of St. Ives.

Although we knew St. Ives was near to the Druids AltAr stones we did not realise that archaeologists from BBC's Time Team had surveyed the area and found not only stone age tools but an area where they had been manufactured. In war time, during the Dig for Victory effort, various Bronze Artefacts were found. Digs were undertaken in 1958 and 1963 and a Bronze Age cremation urn was discovered which can now be seen at Cliffe Castle museum in Keighley. On the moor near the golf course a complete stone circle can be

Crossing the estate are 2 Roman roads. One going from Manchester to Ilkley and one from what is now Tong Street in Bradford, heading towards Elsack. Whilst now they are little more than tracks they can still be seen.

In the 1100's the land was gifted to Riveaulx Abbey in the hope that those giving it would be prayed for by the brothers. At that time iron was found around the area now occupied by the Malt Shovel and was smelted near St. Ives. It was then a monastic grange farmed by the lay brothers. Charcoal was made from the forest wood and used to smelt the iron with sand found in what is now called Sandybanks near the garden centre.

There are special Crosses still seen on some of the buildings which show they are free from taxes. If only we could put some of them on our houses today!!

In more modern times Robert Ferrand established a non-conformist chapel which can still be seen near the café and equestrian centre. There is still a bell house at one end.

Walter Ferrand (1780-1835) married Catherine Twist who lived at Myrtle Grove in Bingley, which is now the Town Hall in Myrtle Park. Her father was General Twist who built the Martello Towers along the south coast. He was a large man and when he was elderly he was carried from Bingley to St. Ives in a sedan chair. Walter built the boat house and developed Coppice Pond and some water gardens. Lady Blantyre was W. B. Ferrand's mother-in-law and was involved in laying out the gardens. One morning W. B. Ferrand was on a walk round Coppice Pond and saw some youths swimming. He shouted at them and then sent an elderly retainer out in a boat to make them come ashore. They tipped over the boat first, which amused W. B. Ferrand, who not only retuned their clothes but gave them each a shilling!!

Our next meeting is at 7.30 on Tuesday 16 February and the speaker is Katie Burnett. Her talk is on "why plants live, why plants die and some plants I couldn't live without".

### THE ELDWICK SANATORIUM – POSTSCRIPT

Following a recent request to give a talk on the subject of the Sanatorium, the opportunity arose to further research the involvement of the two principal characters in the development of the institution and their subsequent lives - Dr Hector Munro

and Dr Margaret Sharp.

Hector Munro was born in Glengarry in Scotland in 1870, where his father was a civil servant and he went on to qualify as a doctor following university at Aberdeen, graduating as M.B., C.M. He was attributed with being The Flying Ambulance Founder, having served in the RAMC and the Royal Flying Corps. He founded the Munro Motor Ambulance Company which was attached to the Belgian Army. The 'Flying Ambulance', as it was known succeeded in getting to The Front in 1914 and, as a result of admirable and heroic work Dr Munro was awarded the Belgian Order of Leopold and three other war medals. When he died in London in December 1949 at the age of 80, he was described as an eminent London specialist in psychotherapy and a member of the British Psychological Society.

So, who would have thought that the 30 year old young doctor would have first made the headlines in Eldwick in 1900? Dr Munro caused resentment in Eldwick when he founded a sanatorium by buying Hillside in Glen Road. There had been uproar in the village thirty years earlier when it was suggested that the derelict Eldwick Beck Mill could be used as an isolation hospital for smallpox patients. Hillside, like many other Glen Road properties, was built after the 1861 Enclosure of Gilstead Moor and became a market gardener's residence.

Young Dr Munro continued the business to give his TB patients, women and children, the environment he thought suitable. Further purchases were to come, Ivy Cottage, Springfield and Heath Cottage, when the Eldwick Sanatorium Company was founded in 1906. With Dr Munro, other shareholders included Mrs Powell of Horton Hall, Mrs Ferrand of Daisy Bank in Gilstead Lane and Lady Elizabeth Roberts of Milnerfield. The three acre site was not in isolation, the villagers argued, but in the middle of a residential area. "The institution of a consumptive sanatorium in their midst will jeopardise the health of the community", the local newspaper quoted. Dr Margaret Sharp of London was appointed the medical superintendant. She lived in Walmer Villas in Manningham and Dr Munro was living in Undercliffe Street, both acting almost as consultants. It was Dr Sharp who, in 1914, when Dr Munro was becoming involved in wartime service, successfully applied to the West Riding County Council, to convert the company into one for children only and established the Eldwick Sanatorium School. In 1919 the WRCC paid the company £3256 to take over the establishment, and the company was eventually wound up in 1919. The Sanatorium School closed in 1939 and it was not until 1946 the buildings were sold for £3060 to be converted back to housing.

Dr Munro seemed to be a figure in society whilst living in Marylebone before the first world war and, amongst the ladies he was to recruit for his 'Flying Ambulance' was an heiress who he first spotted riding a motorbike around central London. Several other such ladies, one became known as Di the Dauntless, were avid motorcyclists, and were helpful to Dr Munro, raising funds. First they were despatch riders, like Lady Dorothy Feilding, Di, but on the Belgian front they became 'larky girls', in breeches, leather boots and overcoats, the only women to live and work in any of the theatres of that global war. By contrast Mr Ramsay MacDonald M.P, joined Dr Munro's motor ambulance and field kitchen, ten years later, in 1924, to become Prime Minister.

This was just one part of Dr Munro's career, who was once described as a socialist, vegetarian, suffragette and nudist. Perhaps the latter is why the children at the Sanatorium practised 'Heliotherapy' out in the wilds of Eldwick!

Dr Margaret Sharp 1871-1963 appears in the Women of the Century Database Display. She was educated at Lady Margaret Hall, Oxford and the Royal Free Medical Home in London. Like Dr Munro, it is not known why she came to Bradford but, when she was refused admission to the local medical society, she took the opportunity to see the value of sanatorium treatment and joined Dr Munro in launching the Eldwick Sanatorium Company.

In 1941 she liked to promote the emancipation of women and had helped many women at Eldwick when she worked at the sanatorium until her retirement from

practice. Her profile was described several times in local newspapers, first when she retired completely at the age of 85, and, later, on her death at the age of 92 in 1963.

She was Bradford's first woman general practitioner, the first Womens Voluntary Service organiser from 1938 to 1956, vicepresident of the National Council of Women and a member of the Old People's Welfare Committee which governed Highfield House and the Norman Rae Scholarship Fund.

When Dr Sharp came to Bradford, a time when the medical profession included few women, she soon made an impression and the time came when she was elected chairman of the Bradford branch of the BMA. In her 34 years of practice she founded the city's first baby clinic, following on from her work with children in Eldwick. Her services were recognised in 1943 when she was awarded the MBE and, in 1946, her portrait was hung in the Bradford Town Hall.

In typical fashion Dr Sharp requested no funeral flowers but, instead, donations to Bradford Old People's Homes, like today's Flower Fund Homes.

Not quite from humble beginnings for two distinguished either ٥f these personalities, but certainly they each made a major impact from their meeting and working in Eldwick so many years ago.
