ELDWICK & GILSTEAD HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY

ARRANGEMENTS HAVE BEEN MADE ...

Our April speaker was Mrs Anne Simpson. Her subject was Flower Arranging and to demonstrate her mastery of this craft she brought along two large containers of cut flowers and foliage. As a mere man, flower arranging is not really my thing but I must confess that watching Anne's two very different displays take shape proved to be quite riveting.

She began by telling us a little about her secret life in New Earswick near York, where she uses her loyal labrador as "cover" on her nocturnal excursions to liberate cuttings of conifers and other twigs with attractive leaf forms. Anne calls this activity "community pruning" and sees this part of her life as an important contribution towards keeping her local environment tidy.

After hoisting a goblet-shaped wire fruit bowl onto the table, she produced a large piece of Oasis® and launched into a detailed description of how to use this green stuff properly so that it retains sufficient moisture to hydrate the many stems she was about to stick into it so artfully. You should start by floating the Oasis® in a container of water and leaving it until it sinks. After removing it, you should secure it with tapes or rubber bands to your chosen vase, dish, bowl or whatever so that your display won't topple over when completed.

Anne next selected a few vicious-looking formium leaves, trimmed them to have nonsymmetrical points and differing lengths and pressed their stems into the Oasis®. (In Spain last January, I watched a parade in honour of Saint Sebastian, who is commonly depicted in art and literature tied to a post or tree and shot with many arrows. Imagine this martyr as our piece of Oasis® and you will get the picture). It is important always to cut the stems because that removes the dead cells and exposes "live" ones that are able to take up water.

By now the leaves were clearly assuming the shape of a classical triangular arrangement. Anne next added eucalyptus

and gypsophila, for more green background, followed by stunning scarlet/yellow gerbera, roses and carnations for the foreground.The result brought gasps of admiration from the audience and Anne proceeded to start a second display of spring subjects in a shallow rectangular tray.

In passing she warned us that tulips are the only cut flowers that continue to grow (towards the light) after they are cut and their wavy stems can ruin an arrangement. As Anne chatted to us her new arrangement took shape, using coloured dogwood, euphorbia (beware its irritant sap!) arum, conifer, camellia, hellebore, hyacinth and redleaved ivy, to name a few. Suddenly another spectacular display emerged and our enthusiastic audience applauded Anne's rewarding performance. **Mike Hitchen**
