OFFICE/TOILETS CONVERSION PROJECT AND BINGLEY POOL

The lease for the toilet block in Jubilee Gardens, as recently amended by Bradford Council, has now been signed and returned to Bradford. The Council has received borrowing approval for £163,500 from the Secretary of State, and can now apply for a loan for the conversion project from the Public Works Loan Board.

A tender for the conversion works was issued on 9 July and the deadline for the receipt of sealed bids from contractors is 12

August. A recommendation from the Council's Project Manager, Bowman Riley, as to the successful contractor will be considered by full Council.

The Changing Places project group continues to pursue the installation of a CP facility at Bingley Pool. It was agreed at the July full Council meeting to fund an electrical appraisal of the Pool in connection with this and to investigate funding for a modular CP facility as a back-up solution.

At the same meeting, a representative from Friends of Bingley Pool (FOBP) raised concerns about the progress of the transfer of the pool to the group from Bradford Council. The Town Council agreed to write to Bradford Council asking that the Community Asset Transfer (CAT) be prioritised and that the pool remain open for a further year at Bradford Council's expense to enable the transition from Bradford to FOBP to take place. The Council is also requesting a meeting about the CAT with the Chief Executive.

Mr Baren retired in 1988 after a number of years as a horticulturalist with Bradford Council. Since then he has worked for Edexcel, formerly BTEC, checking standards

in Colleges of Agriculture and Horticulture across the country. Until last year he was a governor of Askham Bryan College, where he had trained following National Service in the RAF.

He is a former chairman of Yorkshire in Bloom, and has written six books on various subjects including the church and has raised many thousands of pounds for different causes with activities including head and beard shaves. His books for children include: How it All Began in the Garden: Stories Behind Common or Garden Names; How Household Names Began (How It All Began); How it All Began Up the High Street; Victorian Shopping: How it all Began.
