



#### A DIFFERENT KIND OF BOUNDARY WALK

In times gone by there was an annual tradition to walk the bounds of the Parish of Bingley not just for exercise but to confirm their existence. For members of the Long Distance Walkers Club the 32 mile circuit of the historic route could be made today in some way and time of their choosing. My name was mentioned in a description of the walk, having said that, "due to the preponderance of 'facilities' on parts of the route, walkers would not want for a drink!" In actual fact the reference was meant to be close to home, with a collection of 17th to 19th century 'establishments', if only in existence today, being included in a walk.

The original local route started at the Kings Head pub in central Bingley, for the group to walk onwards and upwards, via a pub called the Plough Boy. After Eldwick was reached, the walkers followed the Beck up to the Fleece. This was in the times of Tom Hudson from 1809, father of Dick, from 1850, whose name was later to replace the original title of the 18th century inn. From there, the way led to the highest point of Rombalds Moor before descending to the 17th century Gaping Goose Inn, sometimes called the Goose and Gate at Intake Farm. Like many extremities of the moor when reaching roads, gates were installed within boundary walls and fences. The former Gaping Goose building, pictured, is sited on the high Otley Road at Eldwick Crag, opposite the Hawksworth, junction road to appropriately still called Goose Lane.



A party of 50 or 60 walkers would have been led by the Lord's steward, one Joshua Crompton Esq of Esholt Hall whose family once owned Eldwick Hall. It would be at his expense that a real

party might take place around noon when Tom would arrive on horse and cart with cheese, bread and ale for refreshments. The Gaping Goose had quite a reputation thanks to Joshua. In 1786, his land agent for all the considerable Eldwick property, held a meeting in Bingley to discuss forming a new road up to The Fleece. At that meeting it was said that the miry way that was the road beneath Eldwick Crag had hitherto been kept in repair by his Lordship. He was then prepared to allow 15 guineas to be provided to the inhabitants to undertake the repair of the old road. It was in regular use by the 'jagger men' who travelled from Keighley to Otley and Ilkley with fell ponies, laden with panniers for trade. So the existence of the inn would have been welcome for one and all!

The first licensed victualler at the beginning of the 19th century was Miles Watmough followed by his son Abraham in 1837. William Lund in 1861 was the first to be recorded as both victualler and farmer, with 180 acres. That was because, after his time, the licence was dropped following the venue hosting cock fighting, gambling and bare knuckle fist fights. Many a 'round' was fought behind the inn. Even without a licence, one later tenant in 1872 was described as 'having come down in the world in low circumstances,' in other words he was not often sober. He was followed by the Davey family who only drank their very own fresh spring water.

For a variety of reasons, increasingly in today's world, old pubs are finding times hard so, on the doorstep, with the Glen Hotel closed and the Acorn Inn under new management, just Dick Hudson's is happily trading as ever before. The Travellers Rest (said to date from 1810), pictured, was followed by the Acorn Inn, first listed in trade directories in 1853. The Glen Hotel was one of the first buildings to be erected on the previous 'waste' of Gilstead Moor after 1861, by dialect poet Ben Preston. It is famously said that, "when 'hi' cem inta a bit o brass" - by marrying into the Hammonds Brewery family - he built himself a villa type residence and called it Hammondale, today's Netherdale in



Saltaire Road. Despite the incorrect notice by the bar in the Glen, his new house did not become the Glen, the original building carrying on as before. Broadstones, down at the bottom of Sheriff Lane was a 17th century Quaker settlement of linen weavers before becoming a Temperance Hotel with the onset of early tourism to Shipley Glen. To move with the times it became licensed premises with dancing on a sprung floor and, thanks to holiday cottages, later known as 'New Scarborough'.

In many ways, the history of the Travellers Rest is often not realised today. It had the advantage of having a brew house as well as being a beer house, as opposed to an inn. The Acorn gained that status only because the accommodation at the Travellers was linked to the pub. The late Maureen Green-Royston who lived there at one time, gave a full description, including how, at the back of the building, she would play with her friends in the empty mill dam, then full of tall overgrown weeds. The Travellers Rest closed in 1933 after being sold as a private residence with a covenant not to be returned as a beer house. Later residents said they imagined they could still hear the atmosphere of the former pub with talking and music!
