BIRCHES – THE FAMILY CONNECTION

With the recent transition of the Birches Freehouse it seemed an appropriate time to reflect on, not just a little background of the building, and its links with the Birch family whose name it adopted. Mr Alec Birch and his wife Muriel Birch in their time. with involvement and commitment to the village, could have been termed Mr and Mrs Eldwick. I have been fortunate over the years to have known the late Mrs Birch and her family for providing me with a collection of their archives. The photos of local people at village events would actually make an interesting display for family histories.



That collection of photos, letters and press cuttings is a valuable resource, the photos alone could feature many past and present Eldwick families, related to the school, church, Memorial Hall, Gala, etc. Mr Birch retired as head teacher of Eldwick Primary School in 1965 after thirty years in that post. He had succeeded Mr Tom Murgatrovd, and his wife, the former Miss Muriel Abbott, was also a teacher at the school. Mr Birch had attended Skipton Grammar School, later playing for Skipton Rugby Club, having trained as a teacher at St John's in York. At first he taught at an 'all age elementary school' in Silsden, then at Skipton before becoming a permanent supply teacher for five years for the West Riding County Authority.



Before moving to Eldwick, he became a teacher at Mornington Road Primary School in Bingley. Compared to that large school, his number on roll at Eldwick was fairly constant at 90 or 100 pupils until, in his later years as head, it rose to 150. The accommodation then would have been mainly in the original building with the 1930's extension at the rear. Soon, after taking up his post, Mr Birch took a keen interest in organisations both in Eldwick and Bingley, starting with the Eldwick Gala Association in which he was first a committee member and then the chairman. In that role he always enjoyed being responsible for organising the children's sports, the 1953 Coronation Gala programme names him as race starter. He became a warden at St Lawrence's Church, as well as office treasurer and sidesman until 1961, continuing as committee member.



Mr Birch was a founder member of the Eldwick Dramatic Society who held three plays annually, performing in the tiny church school hut at the rear of the building. One of the photos shows a scene from a play in which he took a role, another of the opening of the new facility, before that of the Eldwick Memorial Hall. It was that which was perhaps the finest achievement of Alec and his team of village volunteers who constructed and completed the Hall. First formulated in 1945 as a fitting tribute to the fallen, it took until 1954 before being officially



opened. A tablet in the Hall pays tribute to the years Mr Birch acted as secretary to the Memorial Hall committee. As a founder member also of the Eldwick and Gilstead Horticultural committee, a member from 1940, then later as president. Both he and his wife were keen gardeners and bee keepers, Muriel even having hives on an allotment in Warren Lane and, like Alec, was a member of the Keighley and Craven Beekeepers Association.

When Muriel lived at Park House (now The Croft) at the top of Park Road, she developed a lovely south facing garden which was to include fruit trees. Details relating to those were kindly passed on to subsequent owners who now know of every variety! In the photo collection is one showing Alec opening the courts of the Eldwick Tennis Club on 31st May in



1961. His keen interest came from being secretary of the Memorial Hall Committee during the time of its involvement in the construction of the courts. Once again, as with other organisations in which he became involved, in recognition of his work, Alec was honoured with the presidency and life membership of the club. On his retirement, he was pictured, at the school, being presented with golf clubs as he was a member of St.Ives. Muriel was a founder member of the Eldwick & District W.I. and, as well as a full list of all others, there is a picture of a W.I. Bring & Buy Sale in her Park House garden in 1970. Pictured here are Mrs Birch turning the first sod for Birches in 1984 with Eldwick builder David Wildman, Mr Birch himself, his opening of the Eldwick Tennis Club in May 1961.


