

ONE PROMISE KEPT

At last! As long ago as 1986 Wimpeys Plc. promised to replace the sign at the entrance to their development off Warren Lane. Shortly after they said that the sign would be changed when the development was completed. Some 18 months after its completion the promised work has been done, although the development is not quite fully completed.

Why all the fuss? Quite simple, really. One of the chief objections to the building of the development was the closing of the gap Eldwick between Gilstead. Its not that we in Eldwick hold anything against Gilstead, but we are proud of our own identity and wish to preserve it. Imagine our feelings when Wimpeys called their development Gilstead Meadows! It was rather like rubbing salt in the wound.

How could it have happened? Lack of knowledge of the locality is the answer. Wimpeys looked at the ordinance survey map of Eldwick and saw that the area of their estate is called Gilstead Moor, although



very, very few people know the area as this. Certainly no one thinks of any part of Warren Lane above the water beds as Gilstead. Consequently, the change to The Meadows is not only pleasing to the Village Society, it makes perfectly good sense. As far as the reported vandalism of the old sign is concerned, we have no evidence that it was

vandalism. The sign was blacked out at the same time as Wimpeys left the development. It is our opinion that the blacking out was done by Wimpeys (who else would have not blacked out the Wimpeys logo at the bottom of the sign?). There is no doubt that the new sign improves the image of the entrance to The Meadows estate, and for that matter Eldwick, as most visitors to our Village pass

the estate.

Finally, what is to be done to finalise the development? The planning consent stipulated that a 5 metre row of trees should be planted along the edge of the development to soften its appearance. These trees are still to be planted.

Didn't Wimpeys also promise a substantial donation to Village funds to provide a permanent amenity for the Village? - Ed.

Entrie sfor this year at 410 were considerably in excess of 1988 and all the judges commented on the excellent standard of the exhibits. Particularly pleasing was the large increase in the attractive Flower Arrangements to 28 exhibits for this Section and the high entry of 26 exhibits by 15 children which included 8 for the new Painting Class.

Trophy winners were: Mr. E. Murphy - John Wild Trophy for most points in Member's Vegetables - Brinley L. Jagger Trophy for best Tomato Exhibit - Ernest Edwards Trophy as Runner-up in Member's Vegetable, Fruit and Flowers and the President's Prize for the most points in Members' and Non Members Vegetables, Fruit and Flowers.

Mr. J. Bentley - H.M. Dawson Trophy for most points in Members' Fruit Section and Arthur Harrison Trophy for most points in Members' Vegetables, Fruit and Flowers.

Mr. J.C. Churchman - Eric Cockcroft Trohpy for best Single Rose Exhibit and Leslie Lund Trophy for most points in Members' Flowers.

Mr. J. Chadwick - Frank S. Whitaker Trophy for best Dahlia Exhibit in Members' Section and H. Whitehead Trophy for most points in Non Members Vegetables and Flowers.

Mr. G. Drake - Robert Smith Trophy for the best Exhibit in Member's Vegetables.
