



WARREN LANE - WHAT NOW?



Many residents now know that following a public enquiry in March 1988 the Inspector has recommended that the Warren Lane site LA/7 be made available for a huge housing estate along with many other potential green belt sites throughout Bradford and Airedale.

Eldwick Village Society and Gilstead Village Society both with legal representation put forward a very strong case for designations of this site as green belt based on the need to prevent urban sprawl and to maintain both villages as separate and clearly identifiable communities. We were supported by Bingley Civic Trust and a total of 414 written objections from residents some of whom gave evidence at the enquiry. This fight is now entering its 10th year and throughout

we have been supported by Local Councillors including the Leader and Deputy Leader of the present Council.

SO WHAT NOW? Lobby all Bradford Councillors.

Firstly Bradford Council by law must decide whether to accept or reject. THE COUNCIL NOT IS OBLIGED TO ACCEPT A PARTICULAR RECOM-MENDATION. In the case of Warren Lane we believe sufficient evidence has been provided TO ENABLE THE **COUNCIL TO REJECT** the recommendation and the Village Society will be urging all Councillors to support this course of action.

Now is the time as never before to make your views known. We ask once more all residents who are against such large scale development to PICK UP YOUR PENS and write to as many Councillors as you can ask-

ing them to REJECT THE ENQUIRY INSPECTORS RECOMMENDATION FOR THE WARREN LANE - SITE LA/7 IN THE LOWER AIREDALE LOCAL PLAN.

You will need to write before the 10th January and any opportunity for verbal lobbying should not be missed. Development on this scale destroys the sense of identity that residents have in our local community and breeds apathy. WE MUST NOT LET THIS HAPPEN TO ELDWICK AND GILSTEAD

I would also like to thank all the regular assistants at the G.C. for their support through out the year and take this opportunity to wish every one A Merry Christmas and A Happy New Year.




ELDWICK JUNIORS F.C.
