ELDWICK & GILSTEAD HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY

Our Spring meetings have taken place and in March, Roger Brook who 'cultivates' the cemetery at Bolton Percy, gave a talk on "Good Garden Plants". "Good" being a subjective word, Roger set out to describe some of the plants which he considered came in to this category. They were mostly perennials, giving good value, every year, those which needed no staking, or little pest and disease control and those with a strong general constitution. Bulbs also featured.

Roger brought with him examples of plants and shrubs which were good for their (evergreen) foliage, flowers, scent, berries, bark etc, as well as some plants for sale.

In April, Maurice Baren gave a talk on "100 years of Garden History" - this generally ranged between 1840 and 1940. The mid to late 1800s was a time of great plant collecting.

We were shown an 1844 "Gardeners Chronicle" magazine with a letter from Robert Fortune about collecting plants in China. There were also articles by Charles Darwin and details of the development of a lawn

mower - not too different to today's cylinder mower. By 1904, Sumner (the founder of Leyland Motor Co) had developed the first steam powered mower.

In 1845 Thompson and Morgan produced a catalogue of exotic seeds and in 1906 Bees had a catalogue containing 4750 varieties of seed for 1d each. In 1860 there was concern about Dutch Elm disease. In 1889, 720 varieties of tulips were shown at the Paris Exhibition and in 1899 the daffodil 'King Alfred' was introduced and is still going strong today. From 1902 to 1937 Russell bred and developed lupins. As can be seen from above, Mr Baren (who has written a number of books) was a mine of information!



MAY 1899 Eldwick News — 100 Years Ago

In view of the exit from the District Council of Mr William Dawson, the vexed question of the water supply to Eldwick was not being raised so much as in the past. However the Council could not get away completely from water at Eldwick. On the advice of their Medical Officer, the owners of 5 premises at Eldwick Cragg, who had their own private piped spring water supply, were requested "to lay a new line of pipes in place of the defective pipes now being used for the supply of water to their properties". The Finance Committee reported that rate arrears, i.e. the non payment of rates for the last half year, in respect of the Micklethwaite and Eldwick District, The Council amounted to £554. directed that action was to be taken to collect these arrears.

On Wednesday 24th, the marriage took place at the parish church of

Hiram Wilkinson to Eleanor Bentley, both resident in Eldwick. The marriage was conducted by the Curate Rev. M. Power

Also on that date, the Local Government Board, in the shape of Inspectors Colonel W. Langton-Coke and Dr. G.S. Buchannan, held a Public Enquiry into the Bingley Drainage Scheme. They heard that parts of the scheme, would eventually provide for a drainage pipe from Dowley Gap to Gilstead, one from Gilstead to Sheriff Lane, and another from Sheriff Lane to Eldwick Beck. No objection to the scheme was raised.

The news was received that Miss Ada Walker of the Eldwick Board School had passed the intermediate B.A. examination of the Victoria University, Manchester.
