ELDWICK FIRST SCHOOL

A View from the Council

The former village school on Otley Road is now nearing the end of its marketing period and the final date for receipt of offers is Friday 20th April. The property is offered for sale by the Council's Asset Management Department in two lots - LOT 1 being the original school building built in 1877 and fronting Otley Road. The Planning Department would very much prefer to see this building retained as an important part of the village's heritage. LOT 2 comprises the remaining land and buildings to the rear. The Council is retaining ownership of the playing field and the management of this facility will pass to the Recreation Division. A right of way is being reserved out of the sale for access to the field from Lyndale Road.

As expected there has been considerable interest shown in the property from private individuals wishing to buy just LOT 1 as well as from the major house builders looking to redevelop the whole site.

FISHBURN BAKERY, ELDWICK

I refer to the impending possible closure of the bakery, unless a buyer can be found. This would be a serious loss to Eldwick and Gilstead.

May I suggest a community cooperative be established to purchase and run this property and business, organised by the respective village societies? The purchase price should be obtainable by means of a relatively small contribution from residents of the area.

I feel there would be a lot of support for this proposal from local residents. The principle that shopping should be done locally is something I would expect the village societies would support. There is clearly plenty demand for the bakery's products, and the venture should be profitable.

I ask that you pursue this proposal through the two societies. There may not be much time. I understand the owner may close the bakery before long unless a suitable buyer is found.


Eldwick Girl To Help Poor Children

17 year old Beth Owen, a Bingley Grammar School sixth form pupil, is spending August this year doing voluntary community work in Kenya under the auspices of the charity Soapbox Expeditions which aids established projects in developing countries.

A 20-strong team from this country is going to spend three weeks in Soweto in the vast deprived area of Kibera. Beth will be involved in helping renovate the school building where slum children with few resources are offered basic education programmes) and run a

children's afternoon club.

Her immediate task is to raise a minimum of £1,325 to cover the cost of building materials, medical supplies and basic equipment, as well as her own travel and food costs.
