
Dear Editor,

I am disturbed to read in the Eldwick Newsletter of the vandalism that took place on the Sunday night after this years Gala.

The dances started off as a huge success but their popularity attracted unwelcome elements, some from quite distant parts. At the time I lived in the house immediately above the Hall, and remember the anger displayed by local residents.



AUGUST 1901 - Eldwick News - 100 Years Ago

On Wednesday the 7th at Bingley Police Court John Moffat, a woolcomber of Eldwick, was summoned for using threats to his wife Harriet Moffat. P.C. Balmforth proved the service of a summons on Moffat but the defendant failed to appear. Mrs. Moffat stated that her husband had threatened to do her serious bodily harm, and that she was as a consequence afraid to live with him. The justices found a prima facia case to be proved and issued a warrant for Moffat's arrest. Wednesday the 24th found Moffat in Court having been brought there from Armley Prison where he had been in custody as the result of the arrest warrant. Harriet now asked for the case to be dropped. It appeared that before the arrest there had been something of a reconciliation and Harriet now said that she and her husband "would try to lead a better life". The Chairman told them that he was glad that they had resolved their differences and that they were both extremely young people with their lives in front of them. He hoped that the husband would learn from his bitter experience. The bench were prepared to withdraw the

case but Moffat would have to pay the costs, this was done.

Bingley District Council at their meeting on Monday the 12th approved plans for a house to be built at Eldwick for Mr John Bruce.

Tenders were again invited from local farmers to supply and deliver milk to Morton Banks Isolation Hospital for the year from 1st October. The successful contractor would be required as usual to submit his cows to the tuberculosis test by, and at the expense, of the hospital board. If any were found to be suffering from tuberculosis he would be required to dispose of (or isolate!) them. Tenders were to be returned to George E. Spencer, Clerk to the Board, by the 31st

On Wednesday the 28th Samson Halliday died at his home, 10 Leylands,

Eldwick, aged 75 years.

On Monday, Tuesday Wednesday the 26th, 27th and 28th due to Post Office distribution problems, the mid day second delivery and collection of mail from the two post boxes in Eldwick did not take place. Thereafter the normal service was resumed.
